READ THIS FORM COMPLETELY AND CAREFULLY. YOU ARE AGREEING TO LET YOUR MINOR CHILD ENGAGE IN A POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS ACTIVITY. YOU ARE AGREEING THAT, EVEN IF PENINSULAR FLORIDA DISTRICT COUNCIL OF THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD USES REASONABLE CARE IN PROVIDING THIS ACTIVITY, THERE IS A CHANCE YOUR CHILD MAY BE SERIOUSLY INJURED OR KILLED BY PARTICIPATING IN THIS ACTIVITY BECAUSE THERE ARE CERTAIN DANGERS INHERENT IN THE ACTIVITY WHICH CANNOT BE AVOIDED OR ELIMINATED. BY SIGNING THIS FORM YOU ARE GIVING UP YOUR CHILD'S RIGHT AND YOUR RIGHT TO RECOVER FROM PENINSULAR FLORIDA DISTRICT COUNCIL OF THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD IN A LAWSUIT FOR ANY PERSONAL INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, TO YOUR CHILD OR ANY PROPERTY DAMAGE THAT RESULTS FROM THE RISKS THAT ARE A NATURAL PART OF THE ACTIVITY. YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE TO SIGN THIS FORM, AND PENINSULAR FLORIDA DISTRICT COUNCIL OF THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD HAS THE RIGHT TO REFUSE TO LET YOUR CHILD PARTICIPATE IF YOU DO NOT SIGN THIS FORM.

By signing this form, I affirm that the information submitted online is true and accurate to the best of my knowledge. I do hereby state that I have legal custody of this child, a minor, who resides with me. While this minor is a registered camper at any Peninsular Florida Assemblies of God summer camp, I hereby authorize any director, counselor, nurse, dean, lifeguard, or other responsible person of said Camp to consent to any x-ray, examination, anesthetic, medical or surgical treatment, and hospital care, to be rendered to this minor under the general or special supervision and on the advice of any physician or surgeon licensed to practice in the United States, when such medical or surgical treatment is necessary. I understand that should such treatment be necessary that the Peninsular Florida Assemblies of God summer camp provides only secondary insurance, and begins where the camper's primary health and accident insurance policy has been extended to its limits. I understand that every effort will be made to contact me regarding any medical attention given to my child.

I also understand that participants at Masterpiece Gardens Camp are liable for damage caused intentionally or maliciously. Damage caused by a participant will be billed directly to the participant responsible and their legal guardian. I understand that youth camp is a voluntary activity. Student must be willing to cooperate with the overall spirit and schedule of the camp. Finally, I understand that every effort will be made to room church groups in the same dorms. However, due to the structure of camp and limited number of beds, this is not always possible.

IMPORTANT 2025 CAMP INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Please read the following information and review the camp policies and what to wear with your child.

CHECK-IN / CHECK-OUT: Registration on the first day of camp is from **10AM to 12PM**. When you arrive at camp, please come to the gymnasium located on the left side of the property once you enter the gates. Lunch will be served on the first day at 12:30PM. Student orientation will begin at 4:15 PM. Check-out time on the last day of camp is 10AM. The Camp will close at 11 AM on the final day of camp.

CAMP AGE: All 7 Youth weeks are for students entering grade 7 through 12 for the 2025-26 school year and June 2025 High School graduates. During recreation, there will be age sensitive events.

MEALS: Meal times will be at 8AM, 12:30PM, and 5:30PM. The Shack Shack will be open 2 times a day in case campers would like some candy or sodas, so you may choose to bring \$10-\$30 per day for concessions. \$10 Snack Shack cards will be available for purchase and can be used in the Shack for concessions. No lunch will be served on Friday.

DIETARY RESTRICTIONS: Unfortunately, because we order our items in bulk, we are unable to order in food for special diets. Attendees with special diets only are more than welcome to bring food that can be microwaved or eaten cold to supplement what we serve. Refrigerated space and a microwave can be provided and accessed during meals. We can also store items in the freezer for them and bring them to them for a meal when requested. We are unable to cook and prepare food brought to camp. Menus can be obtained for review and space set aside **PRIOR TO CAMP** by emailing masterpiececamp@aol.com.

CAMP REGISTRATION FEES: The price of camp includes: registration, tuition, lodging, meals and secondary insurance. If the registration process is not completed prior to the early deadline, add \$50 for the full price. There will be no extensions. We strongly recommend making reservation prior to the early registration deadline. There is limited space at our facility, and the state will not permit an overflow position. The only way to guarantee your space is to pre-register. Any transfer of funds – other than the deposit - from one student to another must be done in advance and not on-site.

PRE-REGISTRATION: No phone registrations or partial registrations will be accepted. Only a deposit with a completed online registration and camper consent & agreement form will hold a spot. Payment must be made online at the CampTrak registration or held spots may be dropped. Walk-ins may be accepted based on our capacity. Students or groups registering by the early registration deadline must pay the correct deposit amount to be eligible for the early registration pricing.

REFUNDS: If a student is unable to attend camp after they have registered, please notify us as soon as possible. Due to programming costs, refunds are no longer available. However, prior to the drop date deadlines, all payments will be applied to the total balance due upon final payment. After the drop date deadlines, groups will be held liable for the full cost of the unused spots. If we are able to resell the unused spots, then groups will only lose their non-refundable deposits.

DROP DATE: All 7 weeks of Youth Camp will have a special drop date deadline which is either 2 or 3 weeks prior to the early registration deadline. This date allows group to reserve spots early. The only limitation on dropped spots is regarding refunds. No refunds will be provided for drop spots, rather, we will apply the balance paid to the final total balance due. After the drop deadline, groups are liable for the full cost of the unused spots.

LICE POLICY: Due to very close living conditions, major disruptions occur when there is a health problem. Lice is nearly impossible to treat in a dorm community such as camp. If a student is found to have lice, we will have to ask that they be picked up from camp, treated, and be nit free for 24-hours before returning to camp. It is recommended that these situations be monitored before leaving for camp. All camps will have complete checks before registration takes place. Please help us avoid embarrassing situations of having to either not admit or send a camper home.

MEDICATION / SPECIAL MEDICAL REQUESTS: Please be sure to fully complete the PF Summer Camper Medication Form on which you must list all medications your child will be bringing and any special needs the First Aid Director should be made aware of. We cannot administer meds without a fully completed medication form. The Camper Medical Form is to be placed in a Ziploc bag with the medications and submitted to the First Aid Director on the first day of camp.

HOUSING: All students will be assigned to dormitory style rooms before arriving on the campgrounds on a first come first serve basis. Dormitory rooms will be separated by biological sex. Add-ons cannot be guaranteed to be housed with their group. We will do our best to accommodate housing requests, but with **NO GUARANTEES!** If the camp reaches capacity you will be offered another week to attend, if available. If all the camps sell out, there will be a local hotel option available. Hotel options are only available if church leadership agrees and transportation is present.

NON-CAMPER POLICY: PFYouth summer camps are **CLOSED** camps. All camp activities including evening services are open only to registered campers and staff. Any child, student or adult violating this policy will be asked to leave the grounds.

LOST & FOUND: Any lost and found items left on grounds after the conclusion of camp will be held for one month. If not claimed during that time period, they will be given away. Items will be shipped back to their owners at their owners' expense.

CAMP PROPERTY DAMAGE: Charges for items broken/damaged during camp will be billed to all parties/individuals involved.

CAMP POLICIES & RULES: By registering for camp, you agree to abide by all rules set forth by the Pen Florida District Council of the Assemblies of God, Masterpiece Gardens Campground, and the District Youth Director. Policies are given as guidelines for every camper to follow. This code of conduct has been established for your student's protection and the benefit of every person present. The lack of cooperation, unnecessary roughness, lack of respect for property, or an unwholesome attitude on the part of any camper will result in expulsion from camp. The expense of transporting the expelled camper(s) home from camp is the responsibility of the parents/guardians.

ATTITUDE / BEHAVIOR

- We should strive at all times to conduct ourselves as Christians with proper consideration shown for others.
- Campers must show respect for leaders, staff, and camp property.
- All leaders are authorized to maintain order anywhere on the grounds.
- No public displays of affection.
- Profanity is not allowed.
- No excessive practical joking. Hazing and destruction of property will result in dismissal from the camp.
- Attendance at all scheduled activities is compulsory.
- No one may leave the campgrounds at any time.
- Sneaking off with someone is grounds for dismissal.
- During services and teaching times, no hoods (hoodies) are allowed to cover heads.
- No personal electronic devices are allowed! This includes iPods, MP3s, cameras, etc. Cell phones may be used in the parking lot during free time but are otherwise off-limits.
- No fireworks, firearms, knives, tobacco, alcohol, drugs, Orby guns, Air-soft guns, paintball guns, or pets will be allowed on the grounds. Except by authorized and approved personnel.
- No improper reading materials such as pornography, erotic novels, violence, or anything in violation camp policies.
- We reserve the right to inspect the contents of all personal belongings, locked or unlocked.
- For the comfort of those around you, please observe habits of personal cleanliness. Take a daily shower!

VEHICLES / GOLF CARTS

- Campers are not allowed to use leader vehicles.
- Campers are not allowed to ride on or drive golf carts. If caught on a cart, you will be subject to immediate dismissal.
- If you have a car parked on the property, you must turn in your keys to your leader or the camp dean for the entirety.

DORMS

- Campers must stay in their assigned dorm room. Do not hang out in other dorm rooms.
- Campers are not allowed to stay in the dorm room for any reason during activities (if sick, go to First Aid).
- Campers are not allowed in the opposite biological sex dorm area. (This is a Christian camp and biological sex is decided according to biblical principles outlined in our bylaws of the Assemblies of God)
- Only 1 camper per bunk. No exceptions!
- Only 1 camper per shower at a time. No exceptions!
- Keep dorm room picked up. Nothing should be blocking aisle ways or doorways.
- Keep bathrooms picked up by wiping the sink after use and properly disposing of your trash.
- No food or drinks are allowed in the dorm rooms.
- Texting pictures from dorm rooms is prohibited.
- Campers must stay in dorm rooms after lights out and must stay there until the wake-up call.
- Leaving the dorm after lights-out is grounds for dismissal.
- Zero tolerance for bullying. There is an immediate dismissal of students bullying other students.

CAFETERIA

- Clean up after yourself. Take your tray and trash to the designated areas.
- No saving places in the cafeteria line.
- Respectfully allow leaders to cut to the front of the line.
- No food or cafeteria items are to be taken from the cafeteria.
- Shoes must be worn at all times in the cafeteria.
- No wet clothing in the cafeteria.

POOL

- You must wear proper clothing: towel, shirts, and shoes are required to walk to and from the pool area.
- No excessive horseplay.
- You must shower before entering the pool.
- No food or drinks in the pool area.
- No pool access if covered in paint from the paint war.
